Class Description:

Throughout this course we will be exploring the principles of Chemistry. First semester will be very conceptual. We get the basic science skills out of the way and learn the basics of chemistry. Second semester will be more application and experimentation.

Absences:

ALL class material will be on our Google Classroom. If a student is absent from class it is their responsibility to find out what they missed. In the event of absence for one or any number of days a student needs to make sure to get homework assignments, notes, handouts, and class work missed. It is your responsibility to hand in missed work when it is due. Work that was due on the day of a missed class must be turned in at the beginning of class on the day you return to class. - Basic Organic Chemistry (if time allows)

Grading will break down as follows:

- Each Quarter your grade will break down this way:
 - o 60% of your grade will consist of assessments these may be tests, labs, or projects
 - 40% of your grade will consist of classwork/homework/labs/projects/other practice
- The semester grade is calculated this way:
 - Each quarter is 45% of your semester grade.
 - 10% of your semester grade is your semester test.
