On behalf of the Perey Scholarship Board of Directors, I invite you to review the attached application instructions and to consider applying for the Perey Scholarship, the Helgeson Memorial Scholarship and the Mack & Judy Cole Memorial Scholarship.

The Board awards the Perey Scholarship of \$2,500 to at least three students who plan to major in education. If the recipient has chosen another major, the scholarship may be of a different amount. The Helgeson Scholarship is \$2,500 based on the donation received from Mrs. Helgeson. The \$1,500 Cole Scholarship is awarded by donations from the Cole Family. It will be awarded to student(s) who plan to major in education and/or agriculture.

The Perey Scholarship was initiated in 1996 upon the death of Emile Perey who, along with his wife Helen, dedicated a combined total of nearly 60 years to the young people enrolled in Forsyth Public Schools, Emile taught various subject, coached football and served as principal, ending his career in Forsyth as superintendent of schools. The Perey's arrived in Forsyth in the mid-1930s and left in 1962. Several alumni decided their memory should live in a scholarship.

Mrs. Perey taught music, K through 12, and left a legacy of outstanding musicals and operettas as well as memorable Christmas programs. Both Emile and Helen were not only teachers but also advocates and friends to three decades of students. Mrs. Perey passed away in 2002.

The Perey Scholarship Fund has, for the past 19 years, administered donations from Allene Helgeson in memory of her late husband, Herbert Helgeson, who attributed his success in the business world to the education he received at Forsyth High School. The scholarship is also in memory of her son, Ryan Helgeson.

Judy Cole passed away in 2020 and her husband, Mack, passed in 2021. Mack and Judy were grandparents to Shane Cole. Judy served on the Perey Scholarship Board for many, many years and the scholarships were of utmost importance to her. She was highly active in keeping past graduates up to date through the annual donation newsletter – **The Report Card**. Mack was a highly regarded area rancher. Their family decided that Judy's work on the Perey Scholarship Board and both Mack and Judy's love for agriculture and education be kept alive through a scholarship in their memory.

When discussing guidelines for all the scholarships, the Board agreed that the student's goals and accomplishments should outweigh academic achievement. In other words, a student with a 2.5 GPA is as eligible for the scholarship as a student with a 4.0. Your application will be considered for all three scholarships.

- 4. List of extracurricular activities/achievements,
- 5. List of community involvement. (Please note if you were employed during any of your high school years),
- 6. School certification (Registrar, Counselor, Principal) of transcripts, attendance, etc. (Copy of transcripts must be included),
- 7. Two letters of recommendation: one from a teacher and one from someone other than a family member who is not affiliated with the school,
- 8. On a separate sheet, in not more than 400 words, tell what field of study you intend to pursue, why you made this choice and how you intend to use this course of study to educate others (particularly if you are not majoring in education).
